





Polo at Caumsett

Polo was a serious sport for Long Island Gold Coast estate owners in the 1920's and 30's. Polo ponies were pampered; their hooves shined to a spit polish; companionship provided to enhance their moods; and luxurious living quarters supplied every equine comfort. The major polo events were played at the Meadowbrook Club, just off Route 106, slightly north of Jericho Turnpike. Marshall Field and his family were members of this club, and participated in many equine events there throughout the decades.



Old-time residents of the Caumsett Estate recall the raucous practice sessions on the lawns surrounding the Polo Stables. Alfie Kuntz, now 96 years old and the son of the estate's head engineer, remembers the staff's children lining up each Saturday morning, ready to vacate the polo field of any sharp rocks that may have caused injury to the animal, its rider, or have an effect on the ultimate chukker's score. Alfie grew up at Caumsett living in the Engineer's Cottage that is located left of the entrance of the park along Lloyd Harbor Road.

James Claydon was manager of the polo stables and whose title, under British classification was "stud groom". It was said of him "what he didn't know about horses wasn't worth knowing." Claydon served in World War I and then on Ronald Tree's estate in Virginia. Tree was Marshall Field's cousin and recommended Claydon to Field for employment. The Claydon family moved to Lloyd Harbor in 1931.

Life was difficult for the head of the polo stables. An average day began at 6am with the exercise of a string of six or eight ponies. Breakfast was at 8pm. At 9am, the horses and ponies were groomed and exercised until lunchtime. One feature of the grooming of the Caumsett horses was the requirement of "bobbed tails" cut straight across.

At four o'clock the groom began the two-hour process of "mucking out" the stalls and feeding and watering the animals. At 5:30pm, dinner was served. Then a final late-night check of the stalls was completed. Each Saturday the yellow Italian brick floors of the stables were washed and scrubbed. Four of Claydon's staff lived at the stables and two lived in the boarding house at the Farm Group.

The Caumsett Polo Stable was designed by John Russell Pope and stands in the heart of the historic state park as a center for horseback riding, classes, equestrian events, and boarding. In 2011 The Caumsett Foundation engaged the restoration architect firm of Beyer Blinder and Belle to perform an exterior restoration of the building, beginning with a conditions assessment. From there, a complete restoration of brick and stone masonry, wood windows, doors and trim, metal roofing, and ornamental ironwork was begun.



The restoration of Caumsett's 23,000 square foot Polo Stable and landscaping was a five year undertaking costing approximately \$3,245,000 and was funded by public and private grants with matching funds raised by the Caumsett Foundation. The stable has 16 stalls, a carriage room, harness rooms, two residential wings for the head groom and staff, and an extensive hay loft. Each stall is decorated with brass ornamentation. The polo stable was used in the (original) movie "Arthur" starring Dudley Moore and in the HBO cable television production of "Mildred Pierce" starring Kate Winslet.

An additional paddock for polo ponies located near the stables was part of the original construction. After Field gave up polo for health reasons, the stalls were gradually emptied of polo ponies and more "hunters" and riding stock were added. Contrary to hearsay, Field did not raise racehorses at Caumsett.

The hub of polo activity centered around the Meadow Brook Polo Club, where the U.S. Open was held along with other top matches. The 100th anniversary of polo in the United States included a retrospective history of the sport sponsored by Cartier at its flagship store in New York City. "Polo U.S.A.: A Retrospective History of Polo



in America," was a timeline from 1925 showing that there were 16 polo fields centered around Westbury, New York, many of them owned by the wealthy families who participated in the sport. Those families included names such as Grace, Hitchcock, Phipps, Heckscher and of course, Field. Many well-known residents of Long Island were members of the Meadow Brook Club, including Arthur and James Burden, Edward Cushing, Childs Frick, D. Stewart Iglehart, William Walter Phelps and Marshall Field III. Meadow Brook was the most important center of polo in the country and everyone wanted to play there.

Clearly, polo was a game for the rich, who were drawn to it to try their competitive side and equestrian skills. But it was also an exciting sport that drew thousands of spectators. Matches were played every Sunday afternoon for six months. The Long Island Rail Road even employed a special parlor car to take fans to and from the Westbury

station for the matches. Spectators enjoyed the elaborate social rituals associated with the game, and families of participants often planned picnics and parties to celebrate the end of a match. They also reserved special rooms in their homes to house the elaborate silver trophies the winners received.

But the advent of World War II put an end to much of high-society life. Polo went into decline as a popular sport. In 1954 New York's "Power Broker" Robert Moses used some of the spacious playing fields for his latest project, the Meadowbrook Parkway. In the 1970's, however, polo began a small resonance. Today, thousands of amateur players and professionals are once again vying for prestigious cups at a new generation of polo clubs, many of them now located in Florida and other sunny areas of the world.

How The Caumsett Foundation Began

Early in 1997, the six members of the Lloyd Harbor Conservation Board met at chairman, Carol Swiggett's house to figure out the newlyformed Caumsett Foundation's mission. They decided that the main objective was to maintain Caumsett's 1600 acres as a sanctuary for passive recreation. Traditional low-impact uses like horseback riding, fishing, walking, bicycling, bird watching and environmental studies were envisioned. They developed a mission statement, named themselves "The Friends of Caumsett" and adopted the original Caumsett Farm logo - the Indian head inside the letter C. Since the Friends group did not have a single cent to its name, each board member chipped in \$25. With this money official stationery was printed, a park brochure was developed, the Foundation was incorporated, and regular contact with the Long Island State Parks personnel was established.

To this day, the Foundation has no paid staff.

It is run by a Board of Trustees consisting of community residents who are dedicated to the organization's mission - "to provide educational programs, low-impact recreation, historic and environmental preservation and conservation of the scenic value, natural heritage and cultural history of the former Marshall Field III estate." The Foundation relies on our annual benefit, memberships, and public and private grants to support its work. The Caumsett Foundation is recognized by New York State as an "outstanding" model of a foundation supporting the efforts of the New York State Parks system.

Our projects, done in conjunction with the State, have been far-reaching. From the proceeds we raised at last year's benefit, we were able to complete The Sliding Door shed, located across from the Caumsett Café. In this space, we launched our Music Series, boasting a varied roster of artists playing all genres of music from classical to pop. Meanwhile, our landscape aficionado and board member, Bob Gannon, oversaw new plantings in the Walled Garden, and replaced our modest water feature with a timeless and striking fountain. After months of fundraising and planning for the Tree Fund, we successfully planted 60 mature trees and saplings in the place of the 200 mature trees we lost during Hurricane Ida. Our environmental interns have undertaken the responsibility of caring for these trees and making sure they are watered properly. We continue to enjoy the beauty of our restoration projects, including the meticulous restoration of the historic Dairy Barn Complex exterior, which was almost beyond repair, as was the exterior of the Polo Stable, our park's most architecturally significant building. In 2020, the Foundation oversaw the complete restoration of Marshall Field's Summer Cottage, designed by John Russell Pope in 1939, and completed the renovation of the Park's visitor kiosk in 2021. This year, we are thrilled to have officially joined the Olmsted network, and look forward to the opportunities this will present our community. Despite the challenges posed by the pandemic, our Foundation adapted in order to continue community programming for children and families. While much has been accomplished, there is much more to do. The Caumsett Foundation pledges to continue its work to enhance this magnificent park not only for current visitors, but also for generations to come.
